<b>Ask Six Neighbors to Join the Challenge and Hand Out Buckets</b>		Week 2	<i>Everyone!</i>
<b>Collect a Continuous Supply of Browns</b>	Paper shreds, thin wood shavings, dry leaves	Week 1–8
